Momentum continues to build around CO₂nstruct Zero, the industry's united response to the need to drive carbon out of construction.

Today (4 April 2022) five more companies from across the broad spectrum of construction have signed up to become CO₂nstruct Zero Business Champions.

 CO_2 nstruct Zero was launched last year to unify industry efforts to cut carbon. The campaign focusses on nine priorities including moves to zero emission plant, retrofitting existing buildings, measuring carbon use and developing low carbon materials.

 CO_2 nstruct Zero Business Champions are businesses that have made commitments in relation to these priorities and have agreed to share their good practice with the wider industry. The newest Business Champions are:
